KIBBLE TALK



BANG! BOOM! YOUR PETS AND FIREWORKS!

As many pet owners know, fireworks can cause a great deal of stress for some animals. Commonly seen signs include:



- * Shaking and trembling
- * Excessive drooling
- * Barking, howling
- * Trying to hide or get into/out of the house, fence or other enclosure
- * Refusing to eat food
- * Some animals may lose bladder or bowel control or experience temporary diarrhea from prolonged stress

Practice Safety - It is advisable to close the curtains and turn on the TV or radio to provide some distraction. Many times pets will seek out a small den-like place (such as a crate), if they are fearful or stressed. If you do not already have a crate, bed or similar place that your pet can call his "own", it is recommended to create that safe place and familiarize your pet with it as a means of reducing stress during fireworks.

Use a leash or carrier - If you must be outside with your pet, keep the pet on a leash or in a carrier at all times.

Take pet for a walk first - If possible, make sure that your pet has time to "use the restroom" before the fireworks start. Some pets are too



frightened to void once the fireworks begin, and this may lead to an "accident" later on.

Make sure pet ID is current - Make sure that your pet has proper identification tags, with current information, in case s/he gets away. This will help the local authorities (who are quite busy this time of year handling frightened runaways).

What can I do if my pet is frightened by fireworks

- Some animals do fine and don't seem to notice the fireworks. Some do well with just having their owner near, talking in a soothing voice and petting or holding the pet. And then there are some pets that cannot be calmed by petting or talking to them - they are simply too upset. Animals that are frightened or stressed can hurt themselves and possibly escape if left alone, and the results can be fatal. Frightened animals running loose are in great danger of being hit by a car. For these animals, it is best to provide a safe place, such as a carrier or crate, to be in while the fireworks last. This alone may be enough of a comfort to soothe some pets. If the carrier or crate is not enough to calm the animal, medication (in the form of a tranquilizer) may be warranted. Tranquilizers are not for every pet. Talk to your vet about medical options that are suitable for **your** dog. A patient-doctor relationship is needed before dispensing medications, so if your pet hasn't seen the vet yet, an appointment will need to be made to examine the animal to ensure that there aren't any underlying heart or other problems, and base any medications on current weight.

KIKI

Previously, Kiki's life had not been "something to envy". Through no fault of her own, it seems she had been bounced around to at least 5 different houses in her young life and, in some way, each one failed her. She also endured medical issues, some fixed, some not.

We understand that she had heart surgery as a puppy. After entering Yorkie Haven Rescue, a complete vet exam and check-up were done. Kiki's heart sounded fine and the vet thought that it was more than likely a Patent Ductus Arteriosus (PDA) that had been repaired. PDA is a congenital heart disease in which the ductus did not close at birth, therefore allowing shunting of blood from the aorta into the pulmonary artery.

This condition is typically identified in puppies during a routine exam. Continual blood flow through the PDA into the lungs produces a characteristic loud continuous murmur at the left heart base. If the PDA is closed early enough, heart failure can be prevented and the left heart dilation reversed.

More information given to us when she arrived is that at one of her stops along the way, in a house with small children, KiKi endured some trauma to her front leg. It was obvious that this was never repaired and allowed to heal itself which left KiKi's front leg to heal a bit crooked. Due to Grade 1 and 2 luxating patellas on her two back legs, KiKi walked a little off. Despite this, KiKi gets around just as well as any other pup and surgery was not recommended.

As you can imagine, when KiKi finally made it to her YHR foster home, she was very scared and timid. She arrived in a small carrier that she was "extremely" attached to. So attached, that she spent the first couple of weeks in it **KiKi in her barking at anyone who carrier, her came close. She would "safety zone".** even eat in her carrier and only allow her foster mom to take her out for bathroom time. As time went on, she started to trust her foster mom a little more and started to come out of her carrier on her own, but always retreated back to it for safety.



KiKi's picture and bio were spotted on the website by her new mom and dad and they just knew that they had to add this precious baby to their family. As you can see from the picture, KiKi has now started her new life and could not be happier. KiKi's new mom and dad have updated us on her and we are sharing their "Success Story" with you.

"We would like to thank Yorkie Haven Rescue for bringing another angel into our lives. Our first Yorkie Angel, Itsy, was a gift to us from a colleague at the elementary school where I was teaching and I am convinced that she

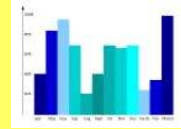

Grooming – Yorkies are a high-maintenance breed when it comes to coat care. Many of us have learned to groom our own dogs and can groom the rescues as well. Unfortunately, some of the rescues come to us as one giant, matted mess, making professional grooming necessary.
